A SIMPLE THEOLOGY "and Jesus wept" ~ Jn 11:35

The path to see God's glory can include pain and suffering. God is not indifferent to our suffering, as we read in John's gospel, Jesus

weeps at seeing the suffering of those he loves, namely Mary and Martha. Jesus wasn't weeping over Lazarus' death, for he knew that he was going to rise him from the dead. But to see the suffering of those he loves was heart wrenching, "and Jesus wept".




