
THE HOLY MASS IN A SACRED SPACE WITH PROPER ACTIONS.



Sometime ago, the parishioners expressed a desire to pray either the rosary or the chaplet of Divine Mercy before each Mass on the weekend and so a rosary ministry team has been leading the congregation each weekend in this prayerful devotion. When we come to Frassati Catholic Academy for the Holy Mass, please try to keep conversation restricted to the lobby area of the school, thereby creating a prayerful atmosphere within the chapel. This prayerful attitude within the chapel should continue even at the conclusion of the Holy Mass as many are engaged in prayers of gratitude for the Blessed Sacrament. The architect and building committee have been working closely in the design of our new church project so that we will have a larger lobby area for conversation and fellowship before and after mass and thus maintaining a prayerful atmosphere within the church itself.

As a parish, we are tremendously blessed to have so many young families with children. When we have had visiting priests from other parts of the country, they have certainly made note of how unique this is within America to have so many young people attending mass regularly. The words of Jesus come to mind, "let the children come to me". Children/babies are most certainly welcome at St. John Paul II Parish. There are many places in the world today and in the first centuries of Christianity, where Christians were not permitted to celebrate the Eucharist.
